



Microneedling Treatment Consent Form

Treatment Description

MesoPen® microneedling treatment allows for digitally-controlled, precise creations of micro-injuries to the skin. The body's natural cellular repair process is stimulated resulting in the generation of collagen and elastin fibers. Superficial micro-channels allow for improved absorption of topical nutrients into the skin. The appearance of fine lines, acne scars, stretch marks, sagging skin, and hyperpigmentation can be effectively minimized. Treatment time generally ranges from 15 – 60 minutes. MesoPen® utilizes a unique worldwide-patented needle cartridge system designed for utmost safety and sterility. Depending on sensitivity levels, discomfort may be experienced during treatment. Topical application of anesthetic may be recommended to help decrease discomfort. Follow-up treatments will be necessary to obtain and maintain the results of smoother, healthier, and youthful-looking skin.

Post Treatment

Immediately following the procedure, skin may be red and slightly swollen in appearance. Skin may feel tight and sensitive, similar to a mild sunburn. This is part of the inflammatory reaction of the skin and will usually begin to subside within 24 – 48 hours. Dryness, peeling, and scaling may be experienced. Special care should be taken to avoid direct sun exposure and harsh topical products for at least a few days, depending on sensitivity level of skin. Gently and properly cleanse the skin after treatments to prevent the risk of infection. If signs of infection develop (pain, heat, increased redness), consult a medical professional immediately. To minimize the chance of possible pigment changes and scarring to skin, follow post-treatment instructions carefully. A minimum of six weeks is recommended between treatments to allow time for the skin to heal.

Contraindications

If you are unsure about your candidacy for microneedling treatments, please check with your physician before beginning treatments. The following are some (but not all) of the medical conditions that may contraindicate a patient from treatment: keloid scars, recently acquired scars, target treatment areas with open sores or wounds, women who are pregnant or nursing, patients with chronic skin conditions that may have adverse reactions to microneedling treatments, patients with active acne, history of herpes simplex infections, diabetics, patients with wound-healing deficiencies, skin with raised moles or warts, patients on immunosuppressive therapy, patients with collagen vascular diseases, cardiac abnormalities, bleeding disorders, and/or active bacterial or fungal infections.

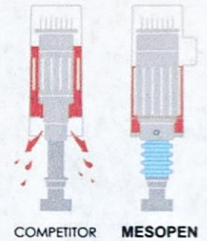
What's the point?

Microneedling is the use of fine needles that puncture the skin in a controlled method to create microchannels allowing for better absorption of topical nutrients and stimulate the body's natural wound healing process. Within minutes of injury to skin tissue, the human body begins the complex process of repairing itself. The production of collagen and elastin helps to improve skin texture and firmness, and reduce the appearance of wrinkles, scars, and stretch marks.

Rollers vs MesoPen[®]

MesoPen[®] is an automated microneedle device. The sterilized 12-point needles of each needle cartridge enter and exit the skin perpendicularly at a digitally controlled speed and precisely selected depth. Handheld roller needle depths depend on the pressure applied to the skin and needles enter the skin at varying angles.

MesoPen[®] needle cartridges are the only cartridges in the world with a unique patented silicone sleeve that prevents cross-contamination. This feature ensures utmost safety and sterility for both clients and operators.



What to expect?

Before starting treatment, ask your doctor if you have any health conditions that may be contraindicated with microneedle treatments. These include but are not limited to open wounds, sores, active acne, blood clotting issues, wound-healing deficiencies, active bacterial or fungal infections, and/or vascular diseases.

Skin should be properly cleansed at the beginning of treatment. Topical anesthetics may be applied. Comfort level varies among individuals and depend on needle depth, speed, and area being treated. Treatment time varies between 15 – 60 minutes. Follow-up treatments are necessary to obtain and maintain the results of smoother, healthier, and more youthful-looking skin. A minimum of at least six weeks is recommended between treatments to allow adequate time for the skin to heal.

This is a normal part of the inflammatory reaction of the skin and will usually begin to subside within 24 – 48 hours. Dryness, peeling, and scaling may be experienced.
